Part 4 – **Animatic** In animation and special effects work, the storyboarding stage may be followed by simplified mock-ups called "animatics" to give a better idea of how the scene will look and feel with motion and timing. At its simplest, an animatic is a series of still images edited together and displayed in sequence with a rough dialogue and/or rough sound track added to the sequence of still images (usually taken from a storyboard) to test whether the sound and images are working effectively together.

Your video should be between 2 and 3 minutes in length.

Download Creative Cloud Media Encoder from the school's Software Center.

-to render in After Effects

Click File ... Export ... Add to Adobe Media Encoder Queue. In, media encoder, make sure H.264 is listed under the comp Name. Click the output file to modify storage location. To render, click the green play button or hit the return key.

Easy Ease – Click Animation ... Keyframe Assistant ... Easy Ease, Easy Ease In, or Easy Ease Out.
